Alexis Carra received her B.A in Theatre Studies, Cum Laude from Yale University. She's currently a full-time Visiting Professor at University of South Florida at the School of Theatre and Dance. After graduating and moving to NYC, she began working extensively on and off Broadway in shows such as Wicked, Sweet Charity, Fosse (1st National Tour) and The Pirate Queen and can be heard in the cast album recordings. Alexis teaches master classes across the globe and has

assisted Tony Award-winning choreographers Wayne Cilento and Andy Blankenbuehler. Alexis is a working choreographer, choreographing commercials for Doritos, The Beekman Brothers, and most recently on the HBO series "Winning Time", directed by Adam Mckay. Most recently she choreographed and associate directed 9 to 5 and Damn Yankees, at Musical Theatre West in Los Angeles. TV acting credits include: Series Regular roles, Mixology (ABC) and Recovery Road (Freeform); guest roles: Grey's Anatomy, Castle, Anger Management, Major Crimes, Criminal Minds, NCIS. Most notably she was a recurring character in the award-winning FX mini-series Fosse Verdon, starring Sam Rockwell and Michelle Williams and in the Disney film, Christmas Again, which can be seen on Disney+. Alexis is also the Co-Founder of a preforming arts mentorship and training intensive, called **Broadway Arts Community** based in New York City and now Tampa. Alexis is on the board of TampaRep, a local professional theatre company, and was just seen at USF playing the role of Diana in TampaRep's production of Next to Normal. open, and inclusive environment in the classroom. He has taught a wide range of subjects, from musical theatre techniques to Shakespeare to K-Pop dance. Leo currently serves as adjunct faculty at Marymount Manhattan College and as a teaching artist at New York City Center.
